Directions

From Little Cove Road at Dogwood Farms sign:

- Slight upward up Bench Mountain Way
- Slight right onto Olde Tyme Way
- Turn right onto Shady Creek Way
- Continue onto Bench Mountain Way
- Slight right onto Bobcat Way
- Bobcat Way turns sharply right and becomes Black Bear Ridge Way
- Slight right onto Bobcat Way
 - House is on the corner on the right (very sharp turn)

*It is difficult for larger vehicles to turn right into the driveway without turning around. Drive to the "Y" fork at end of Bobcat Way and you can turn around there.

Parking

Parking is in the driveway and can hold up to 4-5 cars comfortably. A trailer could fit, but would eliminate car space.

Unlock/Locking Door

House Rules

- No smoking or vaping inside of the cabin.
- No additional overnight guests that are not mentioned in reservation.
- Quiet hours begin at 10pm and end at 7am.
- Inventory is taken of entire house of objects, items, and furniture. Please put furniture back to where you found it and leave all objects and items on/in property.
- There is no daily housekeeping. Please do not take towels or linens from the unit.

Heating and Cooling Instructions

We have a Honeywell Home temperature gauge/thermostat and keep the house at a comfortable rate in the winter and summer. When you leave for the day or a long period of time, please set it to a comfortable temperature (80F) to save energy. Comfortable temperatures in the summer are 76 in the house, and 75 in the winter.

Garbage + Trash, & More

Please place all full trash in the bear-proof receptacles outside, and make sure it is locked securely.

*Always lock your car door. Not just from humans, but from bears. My husband and I made this mistake in October of 2019 and left our car unlocked for 10 minutes upon taking groceries in. Mama Bear brought 4 cubs. One cub ended up getting stuck in our car, all because Mama Bear opened our car door. We became viral on social media and definitely learned our lesson.

We get several questions asking if the tap water is safe for use. The answer is yes, we have a great filtration system and well system to make sure our water great tasting and safe to drink.

Laundry

Guests are free to use washer and dryer if they wish. Please make sure to empty out dryer lint after use.

Hot Tub

Please make sure you put the cover back on the hot tub once you are done using it and adhere to hot tub safety precautions listed in rental agreement.

Coffee

A Keurig and coffee maker are provided for your preference. Make sure there is water in the Keurig prior to use.


